OAK MATURATION

The wine has had contact with premium American oak for a short time.

SHIRAZ CABERNET 2016

85 POINTS

An herbal streak runs through the center, adding a savory element to the plum and cassis flavors, with cedar and spice details and moderately firm tannins. Shiraz and Cabernet Sauvignon. Drink now through 2027.
